Rockin' good way to learn

High school pupils had a taste of the music business to learn valuable lessons and raise charity cash.

Six borough schools took part in the unique Enterprise Rocks challenge to develop their business skills.

Musical acts competed and the best three from each school recorded their top tracks for a compilation CD. The CDs were sold in school and through a local music shop. Forty eight pupils from the different schools worked on artwork and a marketing campaign for the CD, which raised £3,000 for local charities and to fund further enterprise days.

Stumble Motion from St Wilfrid's high school were voted best band overall after their version of the Chuck Berry classic *Johnny be good* brought the house

down. The band, which formed at school last year, played against 16 other bands in the final. It's the second time that singer and guitarist Josh Jubb, drummer Joey Hindley, guitarist Paul McIntyre and bass guitarist Martin Gregson have won a top local competition. They were winners of Rock Fest 2006.

The awards for best CD art work went to Darwen Vale high school, best marketing plan to St Wilfrid's high school and best presentation to Our Lady and St John Catholic Arts College.

The competition was organised by challenge day company E4A and the high schools taking part were: Beardwood, Blakewater College, Darwen Vale, Our Lady and St John, St Wilfrid's and Witton Park.
